


Industry prospers with adherence to quality research

A SOUTH EAST producer has weighed in on the nation's lamb industry, predicting a solid future for the sector in the coming 12 months.

Cashmore Oaklea's Don Pegler has praised the trajectory of the Australian prime lamb industry, believing dedication to improvement through research and development was at the forefront of the change.

Research reaps long term benefits

“When I first started in this game in the early 80s, the lamb industry was quite backward,” Mr Pegler said.

“There had been very little research done, the product itself was mostly used by supermarkets as a loss leader so they would buy cheap lamb and put them through the supermarket cheap so they get all the people in to buy their other groceries.

“We exported 13 percent of Australia’s production and that was mostly New Guinea buying all the off cuts.

“About that time, I think everybody recognised to get the lamb industry to prosper we had to be much more professional in the way we went about things.

“It was tremendous to see the producers in Australia, the processors, Meat and Livestock Australia and the various government departments all come together to work out a way forward.”

This saw the introduction of genomics programs, maternal and progeny testing to produce the best quality animals for generations.

Now working closely with various universities, including Murdoch and the University of New England, Mr Pegler said he was proud to be part of the industry’s future.

“We continue doing research on many things of all the time,” he said.

“It varies from maternal behaviours to embryonic retention, we have measured the telomeres and the chromosomes to ascertain longevity, we also had the genomics program developed, which is looking at all the various genes in sheep.

“It has been recognised if we keep growing larger and faster animals we could start to lose meat eating quality, so through genomics they have now developed meat eating qualities like how much neutromuscular fat the lamb has.

“If you have fat spread through the meat, it cooks more tender and more tasty – they also measure shear force which is how easy a knife will go through the meat for tenderness and then also lean meat yield.

“Everything we do in breeding animals is all about balance and getting the best meat possible.”

Earlier this year, the industry also saw record-breaking lamb prices across the country.

This saw prices sky-rocket to an eye watering \$354.20 a head in NSW and the South Australian record price was set at \$337 by a Mundulla producer.

Mr Pegler said the impressive numbers were due to a combination of factors across the sector coming together at the perfect moment.

“There is the drought and ob-

viously the impact that has made on lamb numbers across the country,” he said.

“But it also comes down to what young people in farming want to do.

“You do not get a lot of people wanting to run around chasing livestock all day when they can ride around on a tractor harvesting crops instead.

Mr Pegler said this made for an “interesting stage” in the industry.

“The world’s demand is going up and production is actually dropping,” he said.

“In many countries, lamb is recognised as the superior product to buy for dinner parties and they are quite prepared to buy it.

“Australia and NZ basically control more than 70 percent of the world market in export in sheep meats.

“African swine fever in China is having an immense affect and production of pork is dropping dramatically so they are looking for alternative protein products such as lamb.”

These are all positives for the industry according to Mr Pegler, but he warned prices will drop later this year which will actually again be beneficial.

“The prices we have seen this year are astronomical,” he said.

“We have seen this \$10/kg for about three months but if you look at forward contracts they are predicting it will be about \$7 by November.

“This does mean a dip for producers but it eases the pressure off meat works paying inflated prices for the produce.

“A small drop for farmers will mean hitting that sweet spot for everyone across the supply chain.”

At the turn of the financial year, regulations which saw lambs with erupting lateral incisors sold as hogget were changed.

Although concerns were raised whether this would impact the quality of Australian lamb, those in the industry has reassured this will not be the case.

Mr Pegler said the new regu-

lations would only mean “a few more lambs” would be sold in months with less productivity, meaning a more steady flow of top quality meat.

“It will help quite a few producers that have slower growing lambs, but also mean there might be some more lamb available at a time where there is normally less,” he said.

“As far as the meat eating quality and looking at the teeth, it is only a month or two difference in the age.

“The next biggest thing we need to look at as an industry is being able to classify the product as far as its tenderness, appearance and suitability goes.

“Somebody has lambs that weigh 22kg and they are only fat score 2, but one or two are just starting to cut their teeth, previously they would have sold them straight off because of the discount overnight if they all had teeth erupt.

“Now they can probably put more feed into them and take them from a two score 22kg lamb to a three or four score 24kg lamb.

“It is getting that premium product rather than that premium price which is most important.”

Overall, Mr Pegler said the industry looks to have a bright future and is not forecasting any major drop-offs in the next 12 months.

“For somebody that has been in the industry a long time, you are always reticent when something has been going really well for a long time – you are wondering where the cliff is.

“The greatest fear I have for probably all of our products on the land is the trade war between China and America – we could quite easily get caught up in the slip stream which would be devastating for Australia with all products we sell.

“But without that, I do not see anything on the horizon that could give too much of a knock to the industry – things are looking very positive.”



The world’s demand for lamb products continues to increase, which ensures a bright outlook for the industry in general.

Market optimism riding high

SHEEP MEAT demand and price are both on the rise, while supply is constrained and predicted to tighten further.

The price of the Eastern States Trade Lamb Indicator (ESTLI) in recent times has been one of almost disbelief among long-term lamb producers.

July saw the ESTLI reach 941 cents. This is a far cry from the 300 to 400 cent range considered normal pre 2008.

Mutton prices have also fared extremely well, with the National Mutton Indicator (NMI) peaking in July at 612 cents.

This is the "cream-on-the-cake" for sheep producers, with the surplus and cast for age stock selling at exceptional values.

Providing further optimism is that there has been an ongoing de-stocking phase in place, especially on the east coast of Australia where the second year of low rainfall has resulted in strong supply of mutton to market.

Up until May, lamb slaughter was running hot and now it has taken a dive.

In their most recent industry projections, Meat and Livestock Australia (MLA) maintained their lamb slaughter forecast for 2019 at 21.2 million head.

Official lamb slaughter for the year to April came in at almost exactly the same level as 2018.

The difference was just 24,100 head, with 2019 coming in 0.3 percent lower.

For sheep, MLA has increased their slaughter forecast for 2019 to 8.5 million head on the back of strong levels for the year to date, up 18 percent.

There should be more sheep and lambs supplied in the spring than we are seeing at the moment, but if we are to hit MLA's forecasts slaughter will have to be a lot lower than last year.

Both lamb and sheep supply is likely to see a significant deficit at some point in the second half of the year.

Prices are likely to ease from current levels towards the end of the year but tighter supply should see them at higher levels than 2018.

A positive for sheep markets has been the growth in exports.

Lamb exports from Australia have risen 139 percent over the last two decades at the expense

of domestic consumption.

The growth in lamb export markets is such that Australia's lamb export ratio (exports as a percentage of production in cwt terms) has increased from 37 percent of lamb product exported in 2000 to 63 percent in 2018.

The situation for mutton exports is even more stark considering that in 2018 we saw 96 percent of mutton production exported offshore, while back in 2000 it was 62 percent.

Release of the July Department of Agriculture and Water Resources red meat export trade volumes show that lamb and mutton consignments have continued to soften in recent months toward levels consistent with their normal seasonal troughs that occur during winter.

High domestic prices for lamb and mutton and low supply are even making their presence felt in softening Chinese demand, an export market that was running red hot earlier in the year.

Total lamb exports from Australia have dipped below 20,000 tonnes swt for the first time this season.

The July figure was reported at 18,238 tonnes, which is only 1.6 percent below the five-year seasonal average trend for July (Figure 1).

Most destinations for lamb trade in July were running below their respective five-year patterns, except for Asia that is, which is still enjoying the boost provided by above average flows to China.

Lamb volumes to the USA were 15 percent under the July average, the Middle East was 22 percent below and Europe 32 percent softer.

In contrast, Asian demand was 28 percent above the five-year average trend after being given a healthy push by China, which reported consignments up 62 percent on the seasonal July average.

Total mutton export flows dipped under 10,000 tonnes swt for the first time this season to make its first appearance below the five-year average trend during July.

Total mutton shipped was reported as 7299 tonnes, 13 percent below the July five-year average level (Figure 2).

Mirroring the lamb scenario, the Middle East is reporting July mutton flows that are 51 percent under the average and European consignments are 94 percent softer.

Meanwhile, mutton shipped to Asia was 29 percent over the five-year trend for July with solid demand out of China leading the charge, running 81 percent higher than the July average.

Combined total flows of mutton and lamb to China have eased in recent months to see the lowest level shipped so far this season at 8089 tonnes swt in July (Figure 3).

Despite the reduced trade flows during July, the levels are still a respectable 80 percent above the five-year average trend for July.

What does this mean?

Apparently, the high domestic price of lamb and mutton during this winter and the tighter availability has made an impact on trade flows.

Nevertheless, the spring flush and lower prices are just around the corner so we should see volumes increase in the coming months.

The combined flow of mutton and lamb to China usually doesn't reach a seasonal peak in volume until November and is nearly double the winter low point.

Given the ongoing issues within the pork sector in China we may be in for some huge monthly trade volumes to China once the flush gets underway in earnest.


While export success is a fantastic result for Australian producers and has supported increased sale yard prices, it has also made lamb less affordable at the retail level.

Higher retail prices have put pressure on Australian per capita consumption of lamb and mutton over the last two decades, driving consumption to record low levels.

The growth outlook in offshore demand for lamb and mutton remains robust.


While the flock remains in liquidation it is going to be some time before we can expand production, so prices are likely to remain firm and could extend higher in the coming seasons, pushing the traditional lamb roast further into luxury meal territory for local consumers.

Figure 1. Lamb Exports – Total





Chrome Sheep Studs' Icon Southies a big success story

CHROME Sheep Studs, located on the outskirts of Hamilton in Western Victoria, has all your needs covered when it comes to supplying rams for prime lamb production.

Nestled in the heart of south-west Victoria's prime lamb producing country, the Tonissens sell around 800 rams a year across their Chromedale, Perendale, Coopworth, Poll Dorset and Icon Southie breeds.

Chrome hosts two major on-property sales annually, the main sale in October and the second in January caters for clients with later joining flocks.

Rams are also sold privately between their on-property sales and after the January sale.

Chrome principal Matt Tonissen said that they supply rams from top end elite stud types right through to the commercial producer working on a lower budget.

"We offer a very reasonable up-set price of \$500 at our auction sales and buyers receive every sixth ram purchased free.

"I don't know of any other stud that offers this sort of reward for volume buying," he said.

The mainstay of the ram breeding operation over the years has been the production of rams for high performance self replacing maternal flocks, across their Chromedale, Perendale and Coopworth breeds.

The Chromedales have been the signature breed for a number

of years now, as more producers shifted to self replacing their prime lamb dams.

The self replacing system offers producers the opportunity to take control of their ewe flock, enabling selection for a variety of profitable attributes such as high weaning percentages, fantastic mothering ability and high growth rates to weaning.

Other characteristics include tough feet, resistance to worms, successful ewe lamb joinings and great pasture utilisation. Surplus ewes can be sold into a buoyant market.

All these traits add up to an easy care, resilient breeding ewe capable of toughing it out in the extreme conditions of Southern Australia, both in the wet and the dry.

Selection for moderate adult weight has been a priority over recent years as well, aimed at producing an efficient medium framed breeding ewe.

Around 2000 mated maternal ewes annually guarantees great depth, ensuring only the best rams make it through to sale.

A real success story, the Icon Southie has been a great initiation, bred to supply a fast growing and early maturing terminal sire that is also suitable for terminal sire lambings out of maidens and ewe lambs.

"By using Icon Southies, one of our large scale clients has reduced assisted births from 10

percent to less than two percent in his ewe lambs," Matt said.

"A great result, improving labour efficiency, lamb survival and ewe mortality."

The Icon Southies now contain predominantly Southdown genetics, the lambs hit the ground running and their early maturing attributes result in a very easy doing lamb that is quite marketable straight off mum or easily finished.

Continued strong demand has resulted in complete sell-outs every year of the Lambplan recorded Icon Southie rams.

The Icon Poll Dorset leg of the terminal sires bred at Chrome offers a stable, traditional meat sheep option with a difference.

They are shorter in the leg, early maturing and having lots of muscle makes for easy soft doing sheep that offer great shape and carcass.

Gone are the days of big, long leggy, slow maturing terminal sires.

In Matt's opinion, lambs sired from moderate framed, high growth, fast maturing terminal sires are the way of the future.

Demand continues to be strong for their Poll Dorset rams given their strong performance, judging by the large Chrome client base.

"Our buyers comment on how nuggetty and early our Poll Dorsets finish, resulting in more lambs on the truck in the first draft," Matt said.



You can be confident with Majardah rams

BY SELECTING Majardah Poll Dorset and White Suffolk Stud sires with moderate birth weights, the need for checking commercial ewes during lambing is minimised and reduces the chances of mis-mothering.

The Price family also lamb up to three months later than in the past, confident that lamb growth rates far exceed what they used to be.

The advantage is matching feed supply to the nutritional needs of the ewes much better than in the past.

"We know some of our clients have been doing it very hard with drought conditions," Adam Price said.

"The only saving grace has been the strong prices for sheep and lambs over the past 12 months due to the reduced national flock.

"It gives us optimism for the foreseeable future in the prime lamb sector," he said.

This year Sheep Genetics Australia has introduced a new Index. It is akin to the old Carcase Plus Index with weightings also given to meat eating quality.

Both C+ and Lamb 2020 have been phased out.

The Terminal Carcase Production index will help protect the excellent eating quality of lamb.

What it doesn't do is reward moderate birth weights and worm resistance.

"It is why we still advise ram buyers to look at the individual Australian Sheep Breeding Values for these traits when selecting rams," Dale Price said.

"Amazingly a lamb that dies during the birthing process doesn't have a lot of weight gain. The TCP index is a good sorting tool, the majority of producers will refer to a ram's ASBVs when selecting rams to meet their production goals."

According to Adam Price, Majardah has had a lot of positive feedback about how well their rams are performing and the progeny they are producing.

"We have also continued to benchmark our rams against others on Lambplan with great results," Adam said.

"By shortening our genetic interval, selecting stud sires carefully to achieve our breeding goals, we continue to be ahead of the pack.

"We are accelerating our breeding program by utilising Matesel (the sheep Tinder) to assist meeting our breeding objectives.

"This will allow us to address even more ASBVs alongside good conformation."

All sires used in the Majardah stud flocks are DNA tested using genomic technologies for hard to test eating quality traits.

The tests are complementary to the traditional ASBVs and contribute to the ram's TCP index, as does the raw data collected on farm.

If sound for conformation, the family then consider the ASBVs to determine whether stud sires or commercial rams meet the standards expected.

The flock is highly ranked on Lambplan due to the attention to detail and the effort put into collecting raw data as accurately as possible.

All stud lambs are birth weighed and electronically tagged to ensure pedigrees and data collected as they grow is correctly attributed to individual sheep.

Genomics tests are conducted to verify superior performing sheep with stud sire potential.

This year's on-property ram sale will be held on October 4 commencing at 1.00pm, with inspection from 11.00am. A light luncheon will be available.

Elders and Miller Whan & John will conduct the sale.

Catalogues will be available from mid September from the agents and will be included on the Sheep Genetics website, with reminders on the Majardah Rams' Facebook page.



Their other AI sire Farrer 160067 is in the top one percent for weaning weight, post weaning weight and both indexes.

Home bred sire Days 170012 is also in the top one percent for weaning and post weaning weight.

For eating quality most sires are in the top 20 percent of the

breed for IMF and shear force with DG150122 being top one percent for IMF and Gemini 160301 top five percent for shear force.

Days Whiteface Maternal Composites continue to make progress selling more rams year-on-year to mostly existing clients from the Fleurieu Peninsula to South Gippsland.

Their fat, muscle, medium maturity, tight skins and excellent fertility are being well received.

Clients TW and EN Mackereth had an outstanding result from their Days Whiteface sired maternal composite ewe lambs, with 864 lambs recording a 160 percent scan percentage to ewe lambs joined.



Johnos endeavours to boost buyer profitability through genetic gains

JOHNOS will be conducting their 21st ram sale at the Naracoorte Showgrounds on Monday, September 30 starting at 11.00am.

This year has been a good one for the sheep industry, with prices that none of us have ever received before for our sheep and lambs.

KD Sheepstuds for easy lambing

KD SHEEPSTUDS has been evolving over 20 years and breeds three sheep types to suit differing climates, environment, labour availability, farmer lifestyle and other animal species grazed.

The stud has three types of composite sheep they have developed using the leading genetics available, to enhance greater profits and ease of management.

KD Sheepstuds doesn't get hung up on a breed name, rather they focus more on the attributes a breed can add to the composite ewe base.

Sheep meat production is always front and centre with their breeding program.

The overriding characteristic with any sheep the stud offers is the easy lambing.

With 19 years of recording and monitoring stud births, there is barely a lamb lost at birth due to difficult presentation, even from lambing ewes 11 months of age.

Hardiness, non seasonal breeding and mating while lactating are also attributes that are prevalent within the breeds KD Sheepstuds has.

The KD Woolled Composite sheep type that have been evolving for almost two decades is used mainly as a terminal sire and has had the Charollais (sheep) breed in the mix for the past five years.

The stud was so impressed with the Charollais Composite

that they have sourced some Charollais full-blood progeny that will be available in 2020.

KD Woolled Composites are a full wool sheep type and with each generation there is an increase in black hooved progeny, making them better for wetter areas.

They are suitable over Merinos, cross-breeds of all types and their specialty is for use over maiden ewes or ewe lambs.

On September 9 KD Sheepstuds will have approximately 40 rams available. Younger 2018 born spring drop rams are available in the months following.

The dual purpose Dohne has been bred since 2007. They grow 4-6kg of 18-20 micron wool and are not designed to be heavy wool cutters but to produce fast growing lambs with good carcasses.

Dohne wether lambs can convert feed into meat more efficiently than traditional Merinos, with growth rates up to 400 grams per day.

Dohne sheep can handle tough conditions, with autumn lambing this year above 140 percent including maiden ewes.

This year's sale rams are from new genetics from Koonik Dohne stud and Mitre Rock stud. New dual purpose Merino genetics from Trigger Vale and Westbrook have been used.

KD Sheepstuds will have 30 Dohne rams available on Septem-

ber 9.

For 20 years the stud has been breeding wool shedding sheep.

The Australian White sheep have been used since 2011 to use with a shedding composite ewe base that the stud has developed. They are now producing the ultimate sheep for easy care and producers in wet areas can now also use this type of sheep with confidence.

The difference is that KD Sheepstuds now have in excess of 90 percent black hooved sheep. No feet are trimmed on rams presented for sale.

The other factor is that Aussie White / KD Shedding Composite lambs are born with a thick hair coat, helping reduce losses.

The ewes are non seasonal breeders and one group of the stud ewes has just lambed for the third time in 15 months.

KD Sheepstuds will have a few full-blood Aussie White rams available, but they are having the best results from Composite bred rams. The new Ultra White is being trialled in the Composite mix with progeny now on the ground.

On Thursday, October 10 KD Sheepstuds will have 40 'Top of the Drop' rams available on-farm at Bordertown. There are 80 rams available this season.

Sale agents explain Janmac's growing popularity in simple terms: "They produce durable rams with the genetic potential to turn grass into top end dollars".

The increased demand for their rams has been built around the quality they have been producing.

Janmac has always been striving for excellence with strict selection criteria for balance, structure, conformation, fertility and performance, especially growth rate and muscling.

These traits will be clearly evident in this year's offering of around 200 Poll Dorset and White Suffolk rams on Wednesday, October 2 on-property at Goroke.

It is Janmac's willingness to invest in the right genetics to achieve

their objective that makes the difference.

A substantial lift was achieved in their Poll Dorset flock when Janmac combined with the Rowett family in SA to purchase Kurralea 110011 in 2012 for a then Poll Dorset breed record price of \$28,000.

Rather than rely on that one lift, as significant as it was, they have continued to seek out the best genetics they can find to match their breeding objectives, and then have been prepared to commit to the necessary investment.

They have followed up with top purchases across both breeds to build on their objective to quietly achieve improvement towards excellence.

Kurralea 160435, the Adelaide

reserve champion ram, was purchased for \$12,000 while they also took a share in Kurralea 160234, the Melbourne reserve senior champion purchased by Ulandi Park for \$15,000.

The first progeny from both these rams will be on offer this year.

In 2018 they added a further four outstanding sires, topped by Ulandi Park 170151 in conjunction with Kurralea for \$17,000.

They also paid \$5000 for another top Kentish Downs ram, KD1780161, then followed up with a swag of ewes from the Kentish Downs dispersal earlier this year.

Grant and Bryce Hausler apply the same breeding principles to their more recent and smaller White Suffolk stud, catering for lamb producers who favour this breeding option.

The highly credentialed Wingamin bloodlines feature strongly in the foundation of this stud, while

they followed up with the significant purchase of Anden 150022Tw in 2016 for \$8000.

This ram had a Lambplan Carcase Plus index of 219.95 and was a son of the then record \$36,000 Anden ram that sold to WA the previous year.

The ram bred exceptionally well for Anden when used as a ram lamb, with eight stud ram sons selling in Anden's 2017 sale, twice topping at \$10,000.

The Hauslers are delighted with the quality lift this infusion has made, with Janmac's first progeny sold last year.

Kurralea White Suffolk genetics have also been added to further boost the quality on offer in their White Suffolk offering.


